

# REGULAR POO PICKING REALLY DOES PAY OFF



Dear Gillian,

Thanks for the prompt result of our samples, all the clients at our Yard are delighted that all their horses are clear.

My wife and I have had horses for over 40 years, and from the start we always had a strict worming programme like many others, worming 3-4 times per year. Then 5 years ago we started our Full Livery Yard, which is small and select, but based on quality sooner than quantity, and it was then when I read about parasites becoming immune to some wormers, and then I saw your company advertised and thought it was the way to go. We manage our paddocks very carefully, and 'Poo Pick' at least every day, and never harrow dung it. This is the **ONLY** way to control worms on grazing and keep them fresh. We never get long patchy toilet areas or sick grass. We also have our Cow, which is the last I bred from our past herd, who provides 'Cross Species Grazing', which also controls parasites, as horse parasites cannot live in cows and visa versa. This means we no longer need to spend lots of money on wormers to **POISON** our horses.

People seem to adopt a clockwork worming programme without even knowing whether their animals have worms or not. I wonder if they in turn take antibiotics every day just in case they might get an infection sometime ?. Even our Cow has benefitted from your service

All the animals at our Yard are much healthier for not being wormed, and I always recommend to everyone if going to a show etc, never to let their horse graze on unknown pasture.

Many friends of our clients have visited us and taken on board our management methods for themselves. Pasture management is a very important part of having horses, and too many people know too little about the subject.
